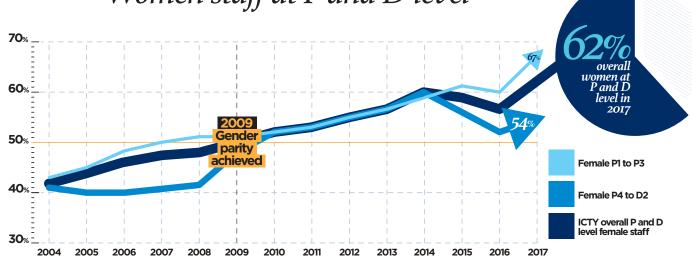

## Over the ICTY's 24 years:

- $m{4}$  Secretary-General appointed ASG Registrars,  $m{1}$  was a woman
- $m{4}$  Security Council appointed USG Prosecutors,  $m{2}$  were women
- 86 General Assembly elected ICTY judges, 23 were women
