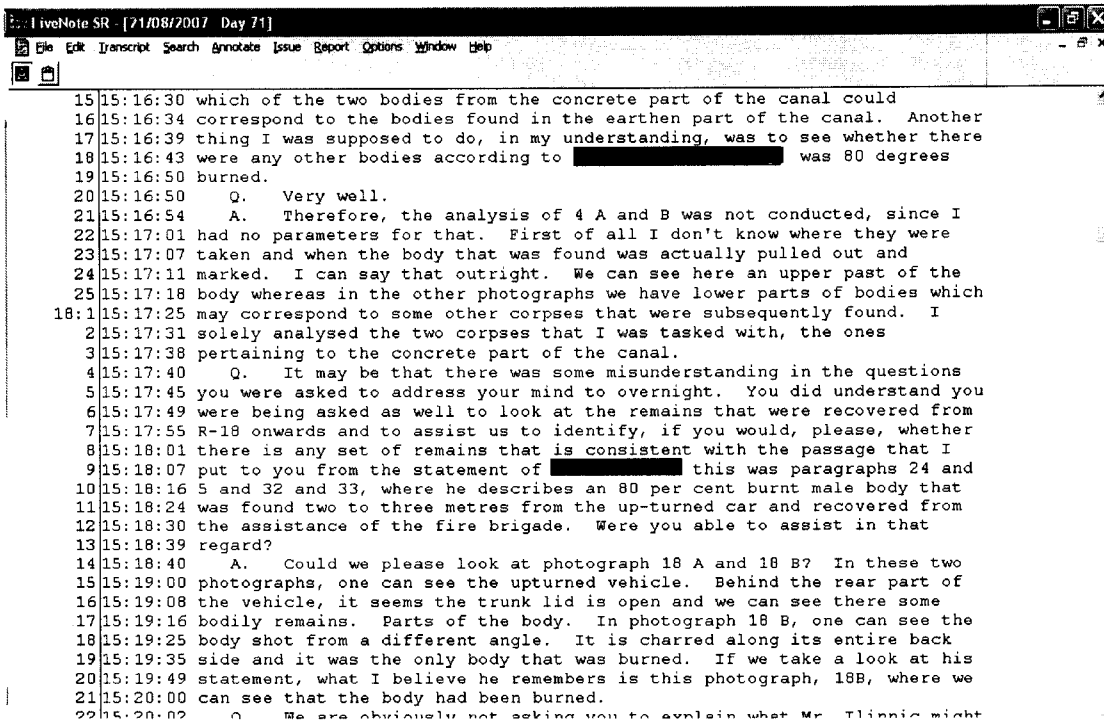

**Order to Redact the Public Transcript
and the Public Broadcast of a Hearing**

The Trial Chamber

(At the request of the Prosecutor / Defence and with the agreement of the parties)
