### JELISIC CASE:

#### NOTICE OF APPEAL FILED BY PROSECUTION

Following the Judgement handed down by Trial Chamber I on 19 October 1999, in which Goran Jelusic was acquitted on a charge of genocide and found guilty of crimes against humanity and violations of the laws or customs of war (see press release 441), the Prosecutor filed, on 21 October 1999, a Notice of Appeal.

The Notice states that, "*the grounds of appeal will be on matters of law, including procedure, and fact in regard to the acquittal of Goran Jelusic on Count 1 of the indictment*".

In accordance with Rule 111 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence, the Prosecution will set out the grounds of appeal and authorities in a Brief of Argument. The 90-day time period for submission of the Brief of Argument commences from the date on which the written, reasoned opinion of the Chamber's Judgement is issued.
