**PROSECUTION NOTIFICATION REGARDING DISCLOSURE**

A. *Trial Chamber's Order of 25 November 2008*

1. Pursuant to the Trial Chamber's order of 25 November 2008,<sup>1</sup> the Prosecution hereby notifies the Trial Chamber that on 14 January 2009, the Prosecution completed its disclosure obligations pursuant to Rule 66(A)(i) of the Rules, for both the Amended Indictment Supporting Materials (filed 24 May 2000) and the Proposed Second Amended Indictment Supporting Materials (filed 22 September 2008).

B. *Status Report on Disclosure*

2. Since the filing of the last disclosure report,<sup>2</sup> the Prosecution has disclosed 3891 items to the Accused Karadžić, totaling approximately 48013 pages, which consists of the following materials:



- (a) Rule 65ter: 2968 potential exhibits (intercepts related to the Accused) have been disclosed, a total of 10488 pages; and,
  - (b) Rule 66(A)(i): 88 items have been disclosed as part of the Indictment Supporting Materials and Proposed Second Amended Indictment Supporting Materials, a total of 7346 pages;
  - (c) Rule 66(A)(ii): 84 items have been disclosed, a total of 8419 pages; and,
  - (d) Rule 68: 751 items have been disclosed, a total of 21760 pages, including 186 documents obtained under Rule 70(B).
3. The Prosecution is continuing to review its evidence collection for potentially exculpatory material pursuant to Rule 68.
