**DECISION ON ACCUSED'S SECOND MOTION SEEKING AUTHORIZATION TO  
EXCEED WORD LIMIT**

**THIS TRIAL CHAMBER** of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the former Yugoslavia since 1991 (“Tribunal”) is seised of the Accused’s “Accused’s Second Motion Seeking Authorization to Exceed Word Limit”, filed on 30 March 2009 (“Motion”) and the “Prosecution’s Response to Karadžić’s Second Motion Seeking Authorization to Exceed Word Limit”, filed on 30 March 2009 (“Response”), and hereby renders its decision thereon.

1. In the Motion, the Accused seeks an additional authorisation to exceed the word limit for his “Preliminary Motion to Dismiss JCE III – Special Intent Crimes”, filed on 30 March 2009 (“Preliminary Motion”) by 2193 words, in addition to the 2200 words extension granted by this Trial Chamber on 23 March 2009.<sup>1</sup> In its Response, the Prosecution does not oppose the Motion.
2. Having considered the reasons advanced by the Accused, the Trial Chamber considers it to be in the interests of justice to grant the Motion.
3. Accordingly, pursuant to Rule 54 the Trial Chamber hereby **GRANTS** the Accused leave to exceed the word limit in the Preliminary Motion by an additional 2193 words.
