I, **Krister Thelin**, Judge of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the former Yugoslavia since 1991 ("Tribunal"),

NOTING Rule 65 *bis*(A) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence ("Rules"), which states that a "Trial Chamber or a Trial Chamber Judge shall convene a status conference within one hundred and twenty days of the initial appearance of the accused and thereafter within one hundred and twenty days after the last status conference",

NOTING the Trial Chamber held a Status Conference in this case on 4 September 2007,¹ during which time a work plan was established, and at which conference the date of the next Status Conference was established to be held on Tuesday, 11 December 2007 in order to ensure that progress is being made in accordance with the work plan as well as to ensure a Status Conference would be held within 120 days as envisioned by the Rules,

PURSUANT to Rules 54 and 65 *bis* of the Rules,

HEREBY SCHEDULE a Status Conference for Tuesday, 11 December 2007, with the time and courtroom of the hearing to be set in due course.
