DARKO MRĐA TRANSFERRED TO SPAIN
TO SERVE HIS PRISON SENTENCE

Today, 23 November 2004, Darko Mrđa was transferred to Spain to serve his sentence, as handed down by Trial Chamber I of the International Criminal Tribunal for the former Yugoslavia (ICTY).

On 31 March 2004, Darko Mrđa was sentenced to 17 years' imprisonment (see Press Release 835e). He pleaded guilty to one count of murder, a violation of the laws or customs of war and one count of inhumane acts (attempted murder), a crime against humanity on 24 July 2003.

Fourteen other accused are currently serving their sentences: Duško Sikirica and Mitar Vasiljević in Austria; Duško Tadić and Dragoljub Kunarac in Germany; Stevan Todorović, Drago Josipović and Vladimir Šantić in Spain; Zoran Vuković, Radomir Kovač and Dragan Obrenović in Norway; Goran Jelisić in Italy; Biljana Plavšić in Sweden; and Hazim Delić and Esad Lanžo in Finland.
