The International Criminal Tribunal for the former Yugoslavia (ICTY) and the International Mechanism for International Tribunals (MICT (Hague Branch)) are conducting a joint recruitment exercise for suitable candidates for the position of Security Officer GS-3. It should be noted that successful candidates will be offered a specific appointment by either the ICTY or MICT (Hague Branch) upon recruitment.

Organizational setting and Reporting:

These positions are located in the Security & Safety Section of the ICTY or the MICT (Hague Branch) under the supervision of Chief of Security

Responsibilities:

The incumbent will provide security of the ICTY/MICT such as; prisoner escort and monitoring, court controls, premise access controls, screening, surveillance, incident and emergency response, report writing, control centre operations, key, weapons and communications issues, alarm monitoring. This requires the constant review and assessment of the security operation to appropriately mitigate risk by taking immediate action if necessary in case of emergency or by providing well thought out and presented suggestions, recommendations to improve current policies and regulations. To provide armed close protection of ICTY/MICT VIPs during official missions or VIPs and dignitaries from external agencies visiting the ICTY/MICT. To ensure accountability, due care, proper use and reporting of malfunctions of all equipment assigned to the operational area of responsibility. Reporting any cases of loss of breakage.

Core Competencies:

- **Professionalism – Professionalism** - Excellent knowledge and demonstrated experience in an operational security profession. Commitment to implementing the goal of gender equality by ensuring the equal participation and full involvement of women and men in all aspects of work. Shows pride in work and in achievements; demonstrates professional competence and mastery of subject matter; is conscientious and efficient in meeting commitments, observing deadlines and achieving results; is motivated by professional rather than personal concerns; shows persistence when faced with difficult problems or challenges; remains calm in stressful situations.
- **Communication –** Speaks and writes clearly and effectively; listens to others, correctly interprets messages from others and responds appropriately; asks questions to clarify, and exhibits interest in having two way communication; tailors language, tone, style and format to match the audience; demonstrates openness in sharing information and keeping people informed.
- **Teamwork –** Works collaboratively with colleagues to achieve organisational goals; solicits input by genuinely valuing others' ideas and expertise; is willing to learn from others; places team agenda before personal agenda; supports and acts in accordance with final group decision, even when such decisions may not entirely reflect own position; shares credit for team accomplishments and accepts joint responsibility for team shortcomings.

ASSESSMENT METHOD

There may be a technical test and competency-based interview.
