THIS TRIAL CHAMBER of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991 ("International Tribunal");

BEING SEISED of a motion seeking leave to exceed page limits, filed by the accused Dragan Jokić, in which he seeks leave to exceed the page limits set out in the Practice Direction¹ in connection with his Request for Disclosure of Evidence Pursuant to Rule 66, Rule 67 and Rule 68 filed on 16 September 2002² ("Defence Request"),

NOTING the Practice Direction on the Length of Briefs and Motions³ dated 5 March 2002 ("Practice Direction") which provides that a motion before a Chamber "will not exceed 10 pages or 3,000 words, whichever is greater",

NOTING that, pursuant to the Practice Direction, "a party must seek authorization in advance from the Chamber to exceed the page limits in this Practice Direction and must provide an explanation of the exceptional circumstances that necessitate the oversized filing",


NOTING that the Defence Request is ten and a half pages in length,

CONSIDERING that the Defence Request only exceeds the page limitation set out in the Practice Direction by half a page,

HEREBY GRANTS leave as requested and accepts the Defence Request as filed.
