**NOTING** the Order in lieu of indictment in the case No. IT-03-67-R77.1, issued confidentially by the Trial Chamber on 13 May 2008;

NOTING that Ljubiša Petković was transferred to the seat of the Tribunal on 28 May 2008;

**NOTING** the Order issued on 23 May 2008 by the Vice-President of the Tribunal, acting on behalf of the President of the Tribunal, assigning the case against Ljubiša Petković ("Accused") to Trial Chamber III;

**NOTING** the Order issued by the Presiding Judge of Trial Chamber III on 28 May 2008 assigning this Trial Chamber to these proceedings;

**CONSIDERING** that it is in the interests of justice and of an expeditious trial to appoint a judge of the Trial Chamber for the purpose of the initial appearance;
