**THE APPEALS CHAMBER** of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the former Yugoslavia since 1991 (“Appeals Chamber” and “Tribunal”, respectively),

**NOTING** the Appeal by Momčilo Krajišnik against the ICTY Judgement of 27 September 2006 (“Appeal Brief”) filed publicly by Momčilo Krajišnik on 16 November 2007;

**NOTING** that the Office of the Prosecutor (“Prosecution”) alleges that the Appeal Brief contains references to protected witnesses that could allow the public to identify them and should therefore be confidential;

**CONSIDERING** that Momčilo Krajišnik is representing himself and might therefore not be in a position to verify which witnesses are under protective measures;

**ORDERS** the Registry to re-file, for the time being, the Appeal Brief as a confidential document; and

**ORDERS** the Prosecution to advise the Appeals Chamber as to which specific references to protected witnesses should remain confidential.
