
THIS TRIAL CHAMBER of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the former Yugoslavia since 1991 (“Tribunal”) hereby renders this order upon the admission of the revised version of Lukić’s interview with the Prosecution (P948).

1. In its “Decision on Lukić Request for Reconsideration of the Trial Chamber’s Admission into Evidence of His Interview with the Prosecution (Exhibit P948),” issued 22 May 2008, the Chamber denied the Lukić Defence’s motion to remove P948 from the official record of the proceedings. In this Decision, the Chamber remarked that corrections to the interview had been identified and were being attended to.

2. At the hearing on 21 May 2008, the Prosecution informed the Chamber and the parties that it had received the revised version of P948 from the Conference and Language Services Section and that it was in the process of being uploaded to eCourt. The Prosecution also emailed the revised version to the Chamber and parties shortly thereafter. The Lukić Defence was given 24 hours to review the revisions and make any submissions it wanted regarding translation issues in relation to the exhibit. No such submissions have been received.

3. Accordingly, the Trial Chamber, pursuant to Rules 54 and 89 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence of the Tribunal, hereby **ORDERS** that the revised version of P948 shall replace the old one and shall be admitted into evidence.
