**TRIAL CHAMBER III** (“Chamber”) of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991 (“Tribunal”),

**CONSIDERING** that during the hearing of 5 February 2007 the Office of the Prosecutor (“Prosecution”) requested the admission of 8 documents<sup>1</sup> while Counsel for the Accused Praljak (“Praljak Defence”) requested the admission of 7 documents<sup>2</sup> related to the testimony of Witness Anel Heljić (“Proposed Exhibits”) who appeared before the Chamber on 1 February 2007,<sup>3</sup>

**CONSIDERING** that the Chamber has examined each of the Proposed Exhibits on the basis of the admissibility criteria set out in its Decision of 13 July 2006 on the Admission of Evidence,

**CONSIDERING** that the Chamber decides to admit into evidence the documents indicated “Admitted” in the Annex attached to this decision since they were put to Witness Anel Heljić and bear sufficient indicia of relevance, probative value, and reliability,

**FOR THE FOREGOING REASONS,**

**PURSUANT TO** Rules 54 and 89 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence,

**GRANTS** the requests of the Prosecution and the Praljak Defence,

**DECIDES** that the documents indicated “Admitted” in the Annex attached to this decision should be admitted into evidence,
