**TRIAL CHAMBER III** (“Chamber”) of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991 (“Tribunal”),

**CONSIDERING** that during the hearing of 23 January 2007 the Office of the Prosecutor (“Prosecution”) requested the admission of eight documents<sup>1</sup> relating to the testimony of Witness CW (“Proposed Exhibits”) who appeared before the Chamber on 22 January 2007,

**FOR THE FOREGOING REASONS,**

**PURSUANT TO** Rules 54 and 89 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence,

**GRANTS** the Prosecution request,

**DECIDES** that the documents indicated “Admitted” in the Annex attached to this decision should be admitted into evidence,
