**THIS TRIAL CHAMBER** of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991 ("International Tribunal"),

**BEING SEISED OF** a "Prosecution's Motion for Variation of Order of 17 September 2002" filed on 23 September 2002, in which the Prosecution requests the Trial Chamber to vary its Order of 17 September 2002 requiring the Prosecution to file amended indictments in the Croatia and Bosnia parts of these proceedings by 26 September,<sup>1</sup> and to extend this time-limit to 24 October,

**NOTING** that the Croatia and Bosnia parts of this case will commence on 26 September 2002,


**NOTING** that the Prosecution states that it is still in the process of reviewing and refining its case in respect of these indictments and is unable to comply with the deadline for amendment set out in the Order,

**CONSIDERING** that it would be preferable to have amended indictments filed by the Prosecution which reflect the scope and nature of its case against the accused and that a delay of one month would not unduly prejudice the interests of the accused or the Trial Chamber,

**PURSUANT TO RULE 54** of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence of the International Tribunal

**HEREBY GRANTS THE MOTION AND ORDERS** the Prosecution to comply with the terms of the Order by 24 October 2002.
