<u>2 February</u> Gotovina et al trial to resume on Wednesday 24 February	The Trial Chamber (Judge Orie, Presiding, Judge Kinis, and Judge Gwaunza) will then hear the first of seven witnesses called by the Chamber.The charges against Ante Gotovina, Ivan Čermak and Mladen Markač relate to alleged crimes committed against Serbs in 1995, during and in the aftermath of the Croatian military offensive known as Operation Storm, conducted in the Krajina region of Croatia. <i>The Gotovina et al trial commenced on 11 March 2008. On 5 March 2009, the</i> <i>Prosecution completed its case-in-chief. On 25 May 2009, a witness re-called by the</i> <i>Prosecution was examined. The Defence case commenced on 28 May 2009 and was</i> <i>officially rested on 27 January 2010.</i>
<u>4 February</u> Jesse Jackson at the ICTY	The Reverend Dr Jesse Jackson visited the ICTY as part of a wider European tour. Rev. Jackson met with President Robinson, Vice-President Kwon, Registrar Hocking, and representatives of the Office of the Prosecutor. Rev. Jackson is one of America's foremost civil rights activists. Over the past thirty years, he has played a pivotal role in movements for empowerment, peace, civil rights, gender equality, and economic and social justice. During the conflicts in the former Yugoslavia Rev. Jackson visited the region and remains supportive of the Tribunal's mandate and mission to hold accountable those responsible for the crimes committed during the 1990s.
<u>5 February</u> Šešelj indicted for contempt again	Vojislav Šešelj has once more been indicted for contempt. Trial Chamber II initiated contempt proceedings against Šešelj "for having disclosed information which may identify11 protected witnesses in violation of orders of a Chamber." <i>Šešelj has already been found guilty of contempt of the Tribunal. On 24 July 2009,</i> <i>he was sentenced to 15 months' imprisonment for disclosing the names and other</i> <i>personal details of protected witnesses in a book he authored.</i>
<u>10 February</u> Perišić trial: Pre- Defence Conference resumes and date for opening of Defence case set	The Pre-Defence Conference in the Perišić trial resumed on 10 February, before Trial Chamber I (Judge Moloto, Presiding, Judge David and Judge Picard). The Pre- Defence Conference began on 29 January, but was adjourned pending a decision on a Prosecution motion. <i>The Perišić trial commenced on 2 October 2008 and the Prosecution officially</i> <i>rested its case on 25 January 2010.</i> At the Pre-Defence Conference the Trial Chamber announced that the Defence case will commence on 22 February. Making the announcement, Judge Moloto added that the Chamber found it reasonable "to allocate the Defence for the presentation of its evidence an amount of time in the region of about 180 hours. And the Trial Chamber decides not to cut down your number of witnesses. If you call all 61, you shall put them into those 180 hours."
<u>15 February</u> Karadžić trial: Representatives of four States are heard; trial to resume on 1 March	The hearing, before Trial Chamber III (Judge Kwon, Presiding, Judge Morrison, Judge Baird, and Judge Lattanzi, Reserve), came as a result of the various motion filed by Radovan Karadžić for binding orders pursuant to Rule 54bis (Orders Directed to States for the Production of Documents). Five States were requested to send representatives: Germany, France, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia and Iran. Bosnia and Herzegovina pulled out of the hearing at the last moment. The Prosecution was also invited to attend the hearing, and was represented. On 18 February, the Trial Chamber issued a scheduling order which stated that Karadžić will make his opening statement on 1 March at 9.00 a.m., continuing, if necessary, on 2 March.

# PROCEEDINGS COMPLETED WITH REGARD TO 121 ACCUSED

Since the very first hearing (deferral request in the Tadić case) on 8 November 1994, the Tribunal has indicted a total of 161 individuals, and has already completed proceedings with regard to 121 of them: 11 have been acquitted, 61 sentenced (three are awaiting transfer, 27 have been transferred, 29 have served their term, and two died while serving their sentence), 13 have had their cases transferred to local courts. Another 36 cases have been terminated (either because indictments were withdrawn or because the accused died, before or after transfer to the Tribunal).

Proceedings are on-going with regard to 40 accused: 13 are at the appeals stage, 24 are currently on trial, and one is at the pre-trial stage. Two fugitives are still at large.

A further 30 individuals have been or are the subject of contempt proceedings.
