On 31 January 2013, the Appeals Chamber decided to accept the withdrawal of the appeals by the Defence of Dragoljub Ojdanić and the Prosecution and declared the appellate proceedings to be concluded as they pertain to Ojdanić. The Chamber ruled that he be

#### **DECISION**

On 31 January 2013, the ICTY Registrar decided that Ratko Mladić was able to remunerate the cost of his Defence, in the amount of 60,992 euros. The rest of the expenses would be borne by the Tribunal. Subsequently, Branko Lukić and Miodrag Stojanović were assigned as permanent counsel and co-counsel to the accused.
