DECISION ON PRLIĆ'S REQUEST CONCERNING STATUS CONFERENCE

On 21 May 2014, Pre-appeal Judge Meron granted Prlić's request and permitted his counsel Karnavas to participate in the next Status Conference, on 27 May, via video link from Cambodia

Radovan STANKOVIĆ case

MICT Appeals Chamber – Judges Meron (Presiding), Antonetti, Robinson, Sekule and Hall

DECISION ON STANKOVIĆ'S APPEAL AGAINST DECISION DENYING REVOCATION OF REFERRAL AND ON THE PROSECUTION'S REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO RESPOND

On 21 May 2014, the Appeals Chamber of the Mechanism denied the appeal by Radovan Stanković against a confidential decision of the ICTY's Referral Bench dismissing his request to return his case to the ICTY. The Appeals Chamber concluded that the Referral Bench correctly considered it would be contrary to the Rule 11*bis* of the Rules to revoke a referral order after the legal proceedings in the State (Bosnia) had been completed. Stanković was transferred to BiH in 2005 and was subsequently sentenced by the Appellate Panel of the BiH Court to 20 years' imprisonment for the crimes in Foča.

KARADŽIĆ case

Trial Chamber III – Judges Kwon (Presiding), Morrison, Baird and Lattanzi (Reserve Judge)

DECISION ON ACCUSED'S MOTION FOR BIFURCATED JUDGEMENT

On 22 May 2014, the Chamber denied the accused's motion for "bifurcated" judgement (i.e. to hold a separate sentencing judgement in case of the conviction) as it finds no reason to depart from the Tribunal's practice - determining the sentence together with the conviction, if any.
