PUBLIC REDACTED VERSION OF DECISION ON DEFENCE INTERLOCUTORY APPEAL FROM THE TRIAL CHAMBER RULE 98 *BIS* DECISION

On 24 July 2014, the Appeals Chamber dismissed the interlocutory appeal (filed confidentially in relation to counts 1 and 2) by Mladic Defence against the Rule 98*bis* decision. The Appeals Chamber concluded, *inter alia*, that based on the totality of evidence in relation to these two counts," the Trial Chamber did not err in finding that a reasonable trier of fact could have concluded that, taken at its highest, there was sufficient evidence to infer that Mladic possessed genocidal intent."

On 22 August 2014, Pre-appeal Judge Meron granted in part motions from the Defence teams for extension of time and word limit and ordered that all appellants' briefs should be filed no later than 4 November 2014.

DECISION ON REQUEST FOR DESIGNATION OF SINGLE JUDGE TO CONSIDER APPOINTMENT OF AMICUS CURIAE PROSECUTOR TO INVESTIGATE CONTEMPT BY OFFICE OFTRE PROSECUTOR

On 22 August 2014, having received the Trial Chamber's reply from 6 August, MICT Single judge Vagn Joensen dismissed as moot Karadzic's request for appointment of a single judge to "consider the appointment of an *amicus curiae* prosecutor to investigate whether members of the Office of the Prosecutor of the International Criminal Tribunal for the former Yugoslavia had willfully interfered with the administration of justice at the ICTY" because of the disclosure violations.
