## DECISION ON PROSECUTION APPEAL AGAINST THE DECISION ON THE PROSECUTION MOTION TO REVOKE THE PROVISIONAL RELEASE OF THE ACCUSED

On 30 March 2015, the Appeals Chamber granted in part the Prosecution's appeal and ordered the Trial Chamber to revoke Šešelj's provisional release and order his return to the UN Detention Unit. The Appeals Chamber, Judges Tuzmukhamedov and Afande dissenting, found that the Trial Chamber failed to

determine whether the requirement for provisional release, set forth in the Rules, remained fulfilled in light of the new information, namely the accused's statements that he would never return to the ICTY. Furthermore, the Trial Chamber is to give the parties, as well as Serbia and The Netherlands, an opportunity to be heard about a new assessment whether further release would be appropriate and under what conditions.

### HADŽIĆ case

Trial Chamber II – Judges Delvoie (Presiding), Hall and Mindua

#### ORDER FOR FURTHER MEDICAL EXAMINATION

On 1 April 2015, the Chamber ordered a further medical examination of Goran Hadžić in order to determine whether he is fit to stand trial. A neuro-psychologist and a neuro-oncologist are to submit their reports in due course. The Registry is to provide written submission, by 9 April, as to when those reports can be expected and when the two experts would be available to attend a hearing on this matter. After the hearing, both parties will file their submissions about the issue of the accused's fitness to stand trial.
