PROCEDURAL DEVELOPMENTS

I. OVERVIEW OF COURT PROCEEDINGS

MARTIĆ Case

Trial Chamber I – Judges Moloto (Presiding), Nosworthy and Höpfel

Beginning of the Defence case

On 11 July 2006, the Defence made its opening statement.

From 12 July until 14 July 2006, the following witness was examined by the Defence and subsequently cross-examined by the Prosecution:

• Slobodan Jarčević (Minister of Foreign Affairs of Republika Srpska Krajina during the relevant period)

The Martić trial will resume on 14 August 2006.

Trial Chamber III - Judges Bonomy (Presiding), Chowhan, Kamenova and Nosworthy (Reserve Judge)

Beginning of the Prosecution case

On 10 July 2006, the Prosecution made its opening statement. The accused Ojdanić also adressed the Court.

Josip JOVIĆ Case ("Contempt")

Trial Chamber III - Judges Robinson (Presiding), Kwon and Bonomy

On 11 July 2006, the parties met before the Trial Chamber in order to start the trial against Josip Jović. The Prosecution had no witnesses whereas the Defence examined one witness, the accused himself, who was subsequently cross-examined by the Prosecution and then re-examined by the Defence.

The Trial Chamber will deliver a judgement in due course.

Examination of Trial Chamber witnesses

Pre-Trial Judge Orie

On 13 July 2006, the parties met before the Pre-Trial Judge for further appearance of Dragan Zelenović. The accused chose not to enter a plea due to the fact that he did not consult his counsel.

On 14 July 2006, the parties met again for further appearance of the accused, who pleaded "not guilty" to all counts of the indictment.

DECISION ON FURTHER AMENDMENTS AND CHALLENGES TO THE INDICTMENT

On 13 July 2006, pursuant to Article 19 of the Statute and Rules 50, 54, 72 and 126bis of the Rules, Trial Chamber II ordered, *inter alia*, that the Prosecution shall file a new version of the second consolidated amended indictment, implementing a number of changes specified in this decision, no later that Friday, 4 August 2006.

DECISION ON JOINT MOTION OF THE ACCUSED MILETIĆ AND GVERO FOR TEMPORARY PROVISIONAL RELEASE FROM 15 JULY 2006 UNTIL THE CONTINUATION OF THE TRIAL

On 13 July 2006, pursuant to Article 29 of the Statute and Rules 54 and 65 of the Rules, Trial Chamber II granted the motion by Miletić and Gvero for a temporary provisional release from 14 July until 14 August 2006.

NOTIFICATION OF WITHDRAWAL OF ORDER IN LIEU OF INDICTMENT AND WARRANT OF ARREST CONCERNING BRANKO ĐERIĆ

On 13 July 2006, Trial Chamber I notified the competent authorities of Bosnia and Herzegovina that the order in lieu of indictment on contempt concerning Branko Đerić and warrant of arrest issued by the Chamber on 27 June 2006 be withdrawn.
