DECISION ON DEFENCE APPEAL AGAINST TRIAL CHAMBER'S DECISION ON SREDOJE LUKIĆ'S MOTION FOR PROVISIONAL RELEASE

On 16 April 2007, the Appeals Chamber dismissed an appeal by Sredoje Lukić against the Trial Chamber decision denying his motion for provisional release.

SREDOJE LUKIĆ DEFENCE NOTIFICATION

On 19 April 2007, the Defence for Sredoje Lukić filed a notification to the Referral Bench that they would not file an appeal against the decision for referral of the case to BiH (Milan Lukić filed his notice of appeal on 18 April 2007)

DECISION ON PROSECUTION APPLICATION PURSUANT TO RULE 54bis

On 18 April 2007, Trial Chamber III ordered, *inter alia*, that a Rule 54bis hearing, initially scheduled for 27 April 2007, be cancelled. However, it was concluded that "the Trial Chamber may determine, based on the report from the Republic of Serbia and the Prosecution response, that a hearing on this matter will still be necessary, in which case it will issue further orders."
